**Greystone Golf Course Receives Multiple Accolades from *Golfweek Magazine***  
*Only Md. course to be named among the “Best Municipal Courses” & “Best Courses You Can Play”*

Towson, Md. — Baltimore County Golf announced today that Greystone Golf Course, located in White Hall, Md., was the only Maryland course to be named among *Golfweek’s* “Best Municipal Courses” for 2008-2009. Greystone was ranked 26<sup>th</sup> among the nation’s top 50 municipal golf courses.

This ranking, which is based on player feedback, comes on the heels of being named one of *Golfweek’s* “Best Courses You Can Play” for 2009. Greystone ranked sixth among the 10 Maryland public golf courses listed, and is one of only two Baltimore area courses among the 10 Maryland courses listed.

“We are thrilled to be honored by *Golfweek* and its readers,” said William L. “Lynnie” Cook, II, executive director of Baltimore County Golf. “This continued national recognition is a true testament of our hard work to create an affordable premier public golf course.”

Every year, *Golfweek* reaches out to its community of 500 raters drawn from every state to rate the nation’s most outstanding public access golf courses. Courses are judged on the basis of 10 evaluation criteria including strategic considerations of shot making, design balance, and aesthetics of conditioning and setting.

In 2004, Greystone received a four-star rating from *Golf Digest* magazine. The award-winning golf course also was named one of the “Best Places to Play” by *Golf Digest* in 2006, 2007 and 2008.

Providing golfers both a challenging and entertaining place to play, Greystone boasts expertly maintained greens and fairways. The course can play as short as 4,800 yards and as long as 6,925 yards. The course also offers more than 80 bunkers creating a variety of shot options. The carts have built-in GPS devices that help golfers navigate the course through the tall hardwood trees, wetlands and native vegetation that add character to the design. Greystone was designed by Joe Lee, architect of Doral Resort’s famed Blue Monster and the courses at Walt Disney World.
